## Structuring your Administration Grid

Before proceeding any further you need to first decide on a structure for your administration grid. There are 5 main structures for the Grid, they are:

No Administration - Do not use any admin features.

Linked Local Administration (default) - Monitor the backup share using a database located on the same server, monitored by Indigo Grid software located on the same server with remote administration disabled.

Independent Local Administration - Monitor the backup share using a database located on the separate server, monitored by Indigo Grid software located on the same separate server with remote administration disabled.

Linked Remote Administration (default) - Monitor the backup share using a database located on the same server, monitored by Indigo Grid software running as a Master and located on the same server with remote administration enabled. A Slave Indigo Grid installation is then located on the administrator's PC and is used to analyse the Master software's data.

Independent Remote Administration (recommended) - Monitor the backup share using a database located on the same server, monitored by Indigo Grid software running as a Master and located on the same server with remote administration enabled. A Slave Indigo Grid installation is then located on the administrator's PC and is used to analyse the Master software's data.
